



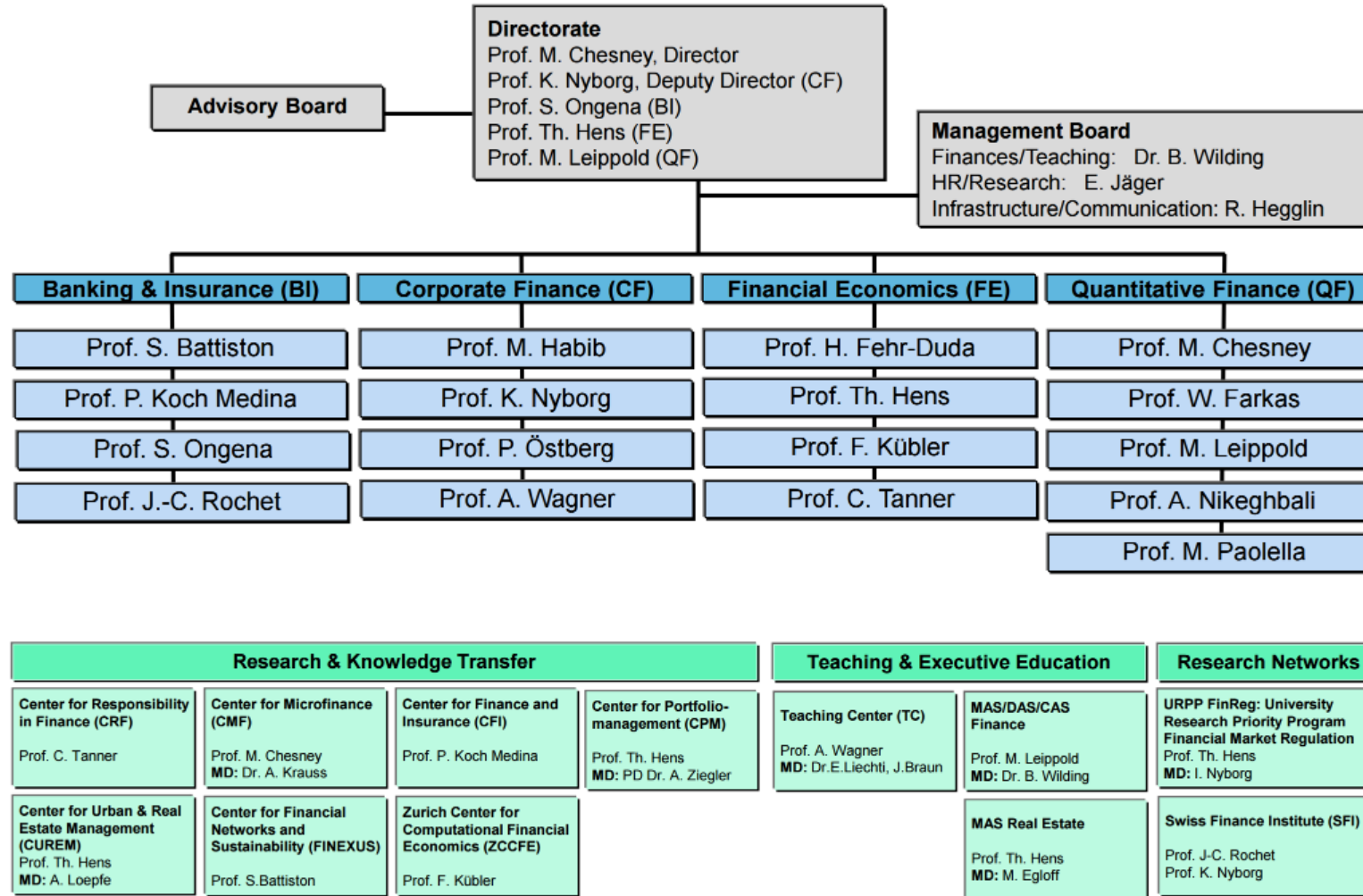

Additional conditions

Additional conditions

- At least 9 ECTS must be earned from seminars in the core elective or elective area
- A maximum of 9 ECTS credits may be earned from teaching assistantships

These ECTS credits can be attributed to the BF2 - BF5 areas

Substitution rule: If the compulsory modules are also compulsory modules in the major study program, the relevant ECTS credits in the minor study program must be substituted with ECTS credits from the BF2-BF5 areas.
